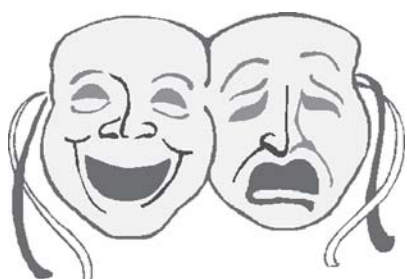

Palm Springs Police Department Traffic Unit Safety Bulletin

The second wave of the Palm Springs “Click It or Ticket” Traffic Safety Campaign is ending June 6th. The second wave proved to be a greater success than the first. Our media campaign reached residents by television, radio, print news and word of mouth. “Buckle Up in Palm Springs” is catching on; drivers are talking to friends, co-workers and family. Make it a permanent change – protect yourself and your family. In the State of Florida and specifically Palm Beach County, almost 60% of traffic crash fatalities could have been prevented by properly wearing safety belts and/or restraints. The goal of this campaign is to increase the seat belt usage rate within the village and thereby reduce the likelihood of injury if involved in a traffic crash. Motorists; make no mistake – if you drive on the roadways within Palm Springs without a seatbelt you will be cited.

As traffic officers, we are often asked, “Don’t you have anything else better to do?” Unfortunately, the answer is a resounding “NO”. Until our seatbelt usage rates are in the 90% on a continuous basis, not just the week or two after a campaign, you are more likely to be injured or killed in a vehicle crash than by a weapon yielding stranger! Traffic Safety is a large part of the “PROTECT” in Protect & Serve and as such our traffic unit, along with road patrol, will remain vigilant to make our roadways some of the safest in the county and state.

We appreciate the efforts of our local businesses: C&D Produce, Spent Paint Ball, Regency Party Rentals, Off Lease Only and Karamba Printing. These businesses provided resources allowing our campaign to include posters and signage posted throughout Palm Springs.

Florida Primary Seat Belt Law:

Seat Belt Laws are being enforced throughout the State of Florida and you will be stopped by law enforcement if you are observed driving or riding in a vehicle not wearing your seat belt. The fine is \$116 in Palm Beach County.

Protect Your Family and Our Water Resources from Household Chemicals

A little pollution here. A little pollution there. An old oil can tossed aside. Solvents rinsed down the drain. A dead car battery set outside the shed. Individually, it may not sound like much. But combined with all the other items improperly thrown away every day, these discarded chemicals and other hazardous waste add up to one of the biggest causes of water pollution in Florida.

With a little knowledge and a little planning, you can become part of the solution. Let’s start by clarifying what are “hazardous household products.”

Typically these are chemicals found in products labeled combustible, corrosive, flammable, ignitable or toxic. They are usually common products that are used in the home daily. Oftentimes, people do not realize that these everyday staples may be hazardous to humans, fish, animals or plants if spilled or not disposed of properly. Learning about these products and how to handle and dispose of them properly will help to ensure your health and, at the same time, protect Florida’s limited water resources.

Here’s How to Work with Hazardous Household Products:

- Reduce your dependence on these potentially hazardous substances by using environmentally friendly substitutes.
- Always read and follow use and disposal instructions for all chemical products.
- Buy only what you need. Use what you buy. If you have leftovers, give them to someone who can use them.
- Dispose of unused hazardous household waste properly.



County residents may take unwanted, household cleaning products; used motor oil, antifreeze, etc.; paints and solvents; pesticides, herbicides, and fertilizers; and any other such products to the **Palm Beach County ‘Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)’ Facility, at 6161 North Jog Road, West Palm Beach, 33412** (Mon. to Fri. 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Sat. 7:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Any Solid Waste Authority (SWA) transfer station will also accept such waste free of charge.

It is illegal to dump toxic chemicals or waste into storm drains or anywhere else that may expose waste in the environment. To report illegal dumping, call the **“Illicit Discharge Reporting Hotline No.”: (561) 304-4609**. This is a dedicated phone line to report suspected violations which may be occurring to our municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4). Please take advantage of the Reporting Hotline No. for follow-up investigation by Village Staff in order that our waterways remain clean and our storm sewer system functions properly.
